What Makes This Camp Special?

Our mission is to improve the performance skills and broaden the knowledge of individual musicians through a comprehensive curriculum designed for the varying ability levels of the participants.

We offer:

- Specialists on every instrument
- Nationally recognized artists, teachers, and conductors
- Private lessons (additional cost)
- Comprehensive program including band, orchestra, stage band, and smaller ensembles
- Dedicated, experienced staff
- Well-equipped, comfortable facilities
- Six hours of instruction per day
- Performance in at least one large ensemble during camp
- Planned, supervised recreational activities during appropriate non-instructional times (Swimming, volleyball, and table tennis are among the many options for participants.)
- Counselors, artist-teachers, and conductors hand-picked from across the nation, based on their musical skills and rapport with young people.

Auditions

- All campers participate in auditions on the first day of camp.
- Lists of specific audition material to be performed are available on our web site. (www.globalcampus.uark.edu/musiccamp).
- Campers are responsible for obtaining their own audition music! Check with your music instructor or local music store.
- Camp staff assigns participants to the ensembles in which they will be appropriately challenged.
- Ensemble placement determines the camper's schedule for the week, and the group in which they will perform during the final concert.

Private Lessons

- Private lessons are available to participants in half-hour sessions. All campers are encouraged to take advantage of this opportunity to learn from our expert teaching staff.
- In order to allow everyone an opportunity to receive private lessons, students in our Jr. High Band Camp are limited to one lesson each during the week. Students in Sr. High Band Camp and Jr./Sr. Orchestra Camp are limited to two lessons each.
- You must send payment (\$10 per lesson) for private lessons with your camp registration. No lessons will be sold at camp.

Facilities and Food

- Resident campers are housed in an air-conditioned dormitory with adult counselors.
- Meals are served at the dormitory cafeteria.

Eligibility

- Participants must have enrolled in school band or orchestra during the 2008-2009 school year and must be recommended by their music directors (indicated by signature on application).
- Junior High campers are those completing grades 6-8 in Spring 2009.
- Senior High campers are those completing grades 9-12 in Spring 2009.
- ALL string students will attend camp July 19-25, 2009.

Fees

- “Resident” fees must be paid by all students staying in the dorm, and include lodging, all meals, camp insurance, and tuition. Dorm space may be limited, so early registration is encouraged.
- “Commuter” fees are paid by day campers, and include tuition, camp insurance, Sunday supper, and all lunches.
- T-shirts are not included in registration fees. T-shirts may be purchased for \$15 with payment of camp fees. The shirt design is shown on the front of this brochure.
- Private lessons are \$10 each and must be purchased on your application form.
- Early arrival at camp is only available for students traveling over 100 miles to camp, or traveling with an instructor who will be a camp employee.
- Applications postmarked after June 13, 2009 are subject to a \$40 late fee.

Cancellation/Refund Schedule

On or before June 12	Refund less \$50 administrative fee
